



Hudson River / Mahicannituck Watershed

1. Otter Creek (tributary to our drinking water reservoir)

276-78 Gifford Rd. (2:45 pm)

(Lake Shore Rd. & Hwy 7) (3:15 pm)**

25 Water Plant Rd. (3:45 pm)

5. Troy Waterfront Park (storm wall & site of recreation on the water, including a marina, river walk, splashpad, amphitheater, and riverfront dining)

255 Front Street (4:30 pm)
